NOTABALE NOTES

What is Apportionment? Every year we pay a certain amount of money for each active member to the Presbytery. This year that amount is \$23.23. This money goes to pay the administrative costs (staff, offices, etc.) of the governing bodies above the local congregation. Of that \$23.23, \$2.20 goes to the Synod, \$6.63 to the General Assembly, and the rest, \$14.40, goes to the Presbytery. Our total for 2012 will be \$3,672. If you would like to pay for your own apportionment, use the envelope found just after January 29th in your box of envelopes. The church pays whether you do or not. Your extra donation really helps!



A Great Opportunity to Strengthen Your Marriage!

PASTOR'S PAGE

On a somewhat personal note, in 2011 I marked 10 years as pastor here at Rhawnhurst. We had a wonderful surprise luncheon in September and you game my family and I a generous gift celebrating the occasion. It has been a good and challenging ten years. Much has changed and is still changing. We look forward to continuing the journey together.

As I reflected in the September newsletter, ten years has seen the numerical decline that began several decades ago continue. Today we have fewer members, smaller worship attendance, fewer paid staff, and less money. In today's economy we have been learning to do more with less. And yet, we have expanded our ministry in some significant ways. Having to do without has led us to greater focus on what matters most.

As you will read in detail in Rhrawnhurst Turning Point report, we have successfully begun a dynamic new work of ministry in our community along with Redemption Lutheran Church. Turning Point first opened in January in a house on Faunce St., and by year's end became a self-standing, separate organization in a more permanent location on Castor Ave. Youth and Young Adults in our community are serving and being served in new ways. We did that!

Another new work in 2011 was the Justice Team. This small group of people began meeting in January to discern how we as a church can be working for justice within our own community and city. The team has been learning much about justice issues I our community, doing research and inviting guests to speak on matters such as Homelessness, Poverty and Criminal Justice and Prison issues.

We have been growing in our ability to form partnerships for ministry. Turning Point in an example of that. Another is our working with the Souled Out Coffee House Coffeehouse, a musical outreach ministry. The Coffeehouse began being held here over the Summer and continues on the last Friday of each month.

You can read their mission statement on our website. It is conceived as a way of spreading the gospel through music and fellowship. Another partnership is the ESL classes led her by Rev. David Verduin, a missionary to the Brazilian population in our area. Finally, we are strengthening our partnering with the Pakistani Presbyterian Church, trying to go beyond renting to them to ministering and worshiping together.

In these days when we must do more with less, the future of gospel ministry, as well as the continued health of Rhawnhurst Presbyterian Church, we depend more and more on the ability to partner with others to accomplish the work God desires His Church to do.

To dare some broad analysis, our church today, as may (every?) mainline church, faces a two-sided challenge to survive. First, survival as an institution, the other, doing the work ministry. We are accustomed to thinking that we can only do the work of the church, worshipping and proclaiming Christ, as the institution we have always been, with its buildings, budgets, staffs, and structure. As that becomes harder and harder due to lack of money and less interest in such things, we grieve the decline of the church. But the need for Christ is only rising, and the church is called to proclaim Him through work and deed, we can, and must, adapt our institution to the work. The work of gospel ministry, the proclamation of Jesus, is the end; the institution, the particular organization is the means.

Ten years. A small piece of our 82 years as a church here in Rhawnhurst. There are many years ahead for us. There is much more to be done.




Sr. High Youth Group (9-12th grades)
