ISIS, Ebola...there is a lot to fear out there these days. There is true danger, true evil around us, even if it is hard to discern the truth behind the hype. But we are entering the holidays of remembrance. A block from the church the Lubavitcher Center has had their sukkah up celebrating the festival of Sukkot. We don't recognize that holiday, but we could, since we too are children of Abraham. The festival given to Israel in the Law (see Leviticus 23:33-36), was to remind the people of their dwelling in tents, or booths, called "sukkahs," during the time in the wilderness, when God provided for them in every way, sustaining them in the desert, where it was impossible to survive. It is also a harvest festival, celebrating God's provision every year through the harvest.

We don't celebrate Sukkot because we instead focus on the even greater provision that we have received in Jesus. Through his death and resurrection, Jesus has rescued us from death and has given us the hope of his presence in this sometimes scary and desolate desert we live in today. Our harvest recognitions, our celebration of Thanksgiving, and of course our Christmas celebrations all remind us of the God who provides and who is among us, and near to each one of us. This is why Jesus tells us not to worry, not to fear, since our Father is indeed our God.
